For a while now there have been talks on having a Netball Premier League and it is difficult to follow the progress or hold ups on it. It is pleasing to learn that the Minister intends making his mark in schools during his tenure. It is all well and good to say that sports must be promoted in schools, but do schools have required infrastructure and facilities?

Is there a program that links the Departments of Education, Sports and Recreation, Social Development, Health and Public Works in promoting sports? The burden of disease is obviously heavy on South Africa and therefore it is in the interest of the Health Department to have citizens participating in sports as part of living healthy lifestyles. Young people engaged in sports are generally well behaved compared to their counter parts who don't, it is therefore in the interest of Social Development to have more people participating in sports and Public Works ought to ensure that we have desired facilities.
