Posts are not filled because they wait for their friends to come and fill them even if they are not suitable for the posts. Posts must be advertised properly, so as to give people a chance to apply.

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There is no service delivery in our Municipalities, roads are bad, no water.

People in Rural areas are paying the same amount for motor licences, but their

roads are worse than in urban areas.

This Hon, Speaker, is unfair to others as the Department of Finance has offered

technical support to assist Municipalities to prepare and submit quality reports.

Some Municipalities decide not to submit reports- Why? Is it like this? Lack of

commitment, dedication and hardwork, above all, not qualified enough to do

the job.
